The Senses and Sensory Experience in Japanese Literature and Culture

October 8-10, 2015 University of Illinois Urbana Champaign

Call for Papers

The University of Illinois will host the 24th Conference of the Association for Japanese Literary Studies at the Urbana Champaign Campus on October 8th to 10th, 2015. The theme of this year's conference will be, "The Senses and Sensory Experience in Japanese Literature and Culture." We encourage participants to submit either full panel proposals or individual paper proposals on topics related to this theme. Graduate students are especially welcome. Presentations may be delivered in either English or Japanese.

Possible topics could include: the five senses in pre-modern Japanese narrative; sound and visuality in poetry and performing arts; the senses in religious and spiritual practices; sensory deprivation (including blindness and deafness); the visual and haptic in Japanese culture; mixed media in traditional and modern arts; synesthesia; the sensory experience and the modern city; senses and avant-garde literature; and Japanese aesthetics and the senses.

The deadline for submission of paper and panel proposals will be **June 30**, **2015**. Paper proposals should be no longer than 250 words; panel proposals should also include a 300-word description of the panel.

2014 Meeting Report

The Center for East Asian Studies at Western Washington University hosted the 23rd Meeting of the Association for Japanese Literary Studies on October 10-11, 2014. The Conference was chaired by CEAS director Dr. Massimiliano Tomasi.

The conference explored the intersections between literature and the realms of spirituality and religion. We had approximately forty research presentations culminating in the keynote address by Professor Miyasaka Satoru (Former President of Ferris University, and President, International Society for Akutagawa Ryunosuke Studies) titled "Religion and Spirituali-

ty in Modern Japanese Literature." Panels covered such topics as "Renditions of Christianity in Modern Japanese Literature," "Demonology, Divination and Supernatural Abductions," and "Metaphorical Representations of the Sacred," and included a feature panel presentation in which Professor Miyasaka was joined Prof. Tsuboi (International Research Center for Japanese Studies, Kyoto) in a roundtable discussion that was moderated by Prof. Eiji Sekine of Purdue University.

The conference provided an excellent opportunity to address the dialectic of literature and religion, discuss how spiritual and religious experiences have engendered literature across time, and debate how negotiations between the spiritual and literary domains may have led to forms of coherent discourse on the divine and the afterlife.

It was an extremely stimulating and productive meeting. The participation of a diverse group of researchers and a substantial presence of international scholars enriched the content of the conference beyond expectations.
